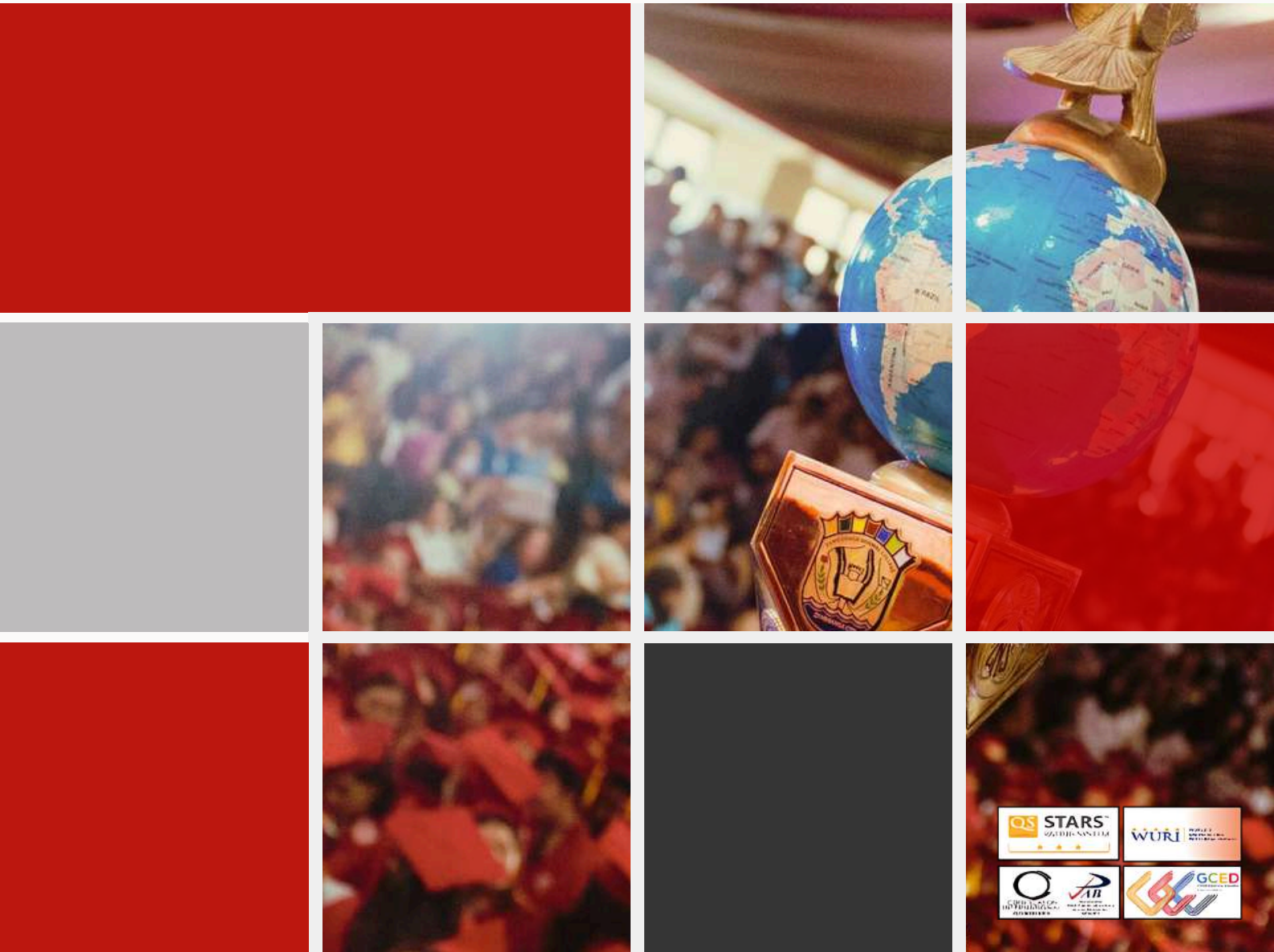

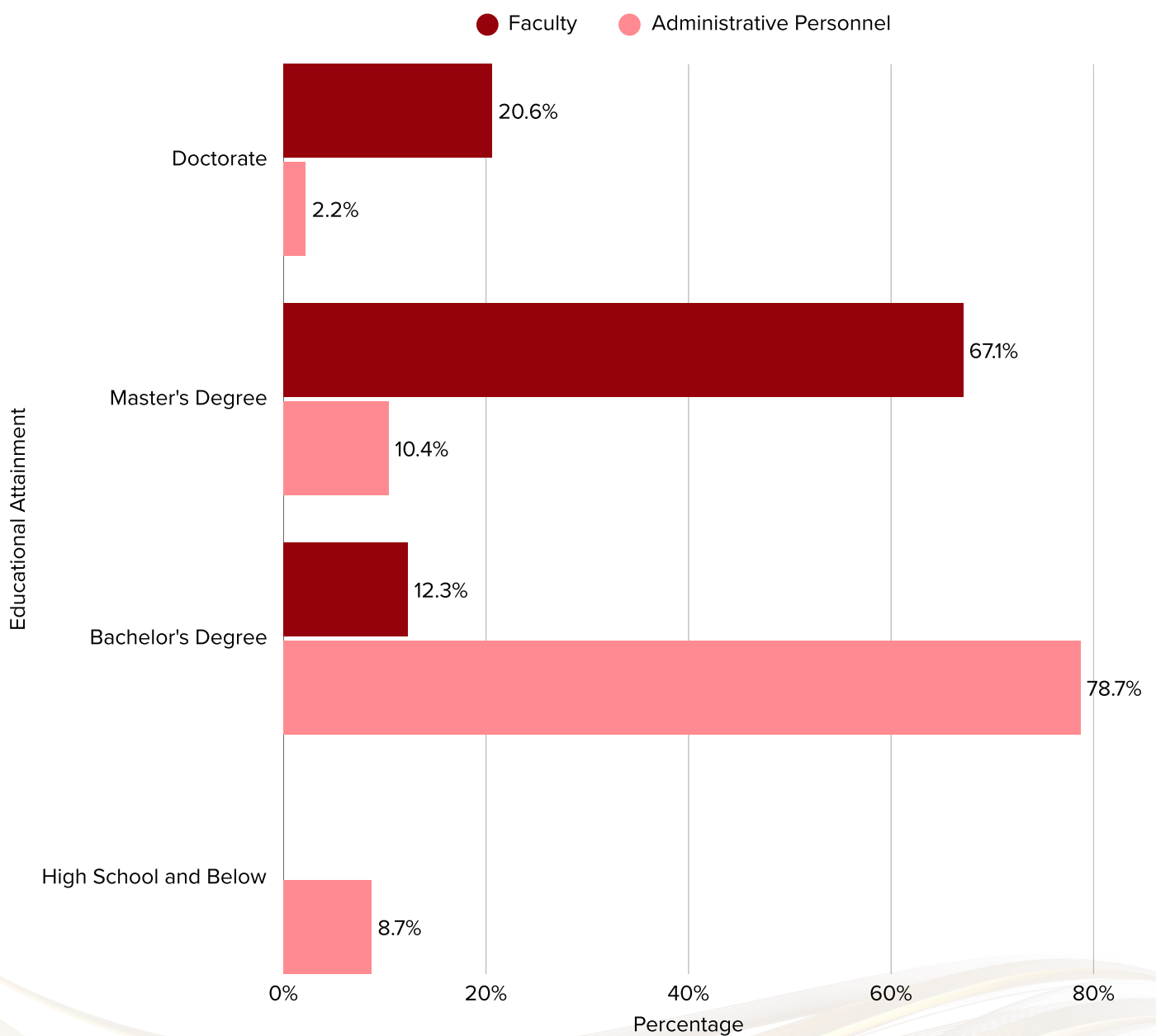
A Brief History of WMSU

Western Mindanao State University (WMSU) traces its roots to 1904 as a small secondary school established to meet the demand for educators in Mindanao and Sulu. Departing from the religious-focused Spanish system, it embraced a broader, liberal curriculum influenced by the American public school model, helping position Zamboanga as an educational hub.

Key milestones include its evolution into the Zamboanga Normal School in 1918, Zamboanga Normal College in 1961, and Zamboanga State College in 1969. In 1978, it became WMSU through Presidential Decree 1427.

Today, WMSU is the leading academic institution in the region, with 17 colleges, 15 campuses, and over 18,000 students, committed to global standards and the development of future-ready graduates.
